A WAY TO RAISE AND RESOLVE
OBJECTIONS* TO DECISIONS AND ACTIONS

*OBJECTIONS ARE REASONS NOT TO DO SOMETHING

- when consenting with the proposal can cause us harm (on fulfilling our driver)
- when there is an opportunity to improve the proposal now (in order to better fulfill our driver)

Consent Decision Making



Why:

To integrate relevant perspectives into decisions in an effective way.

How:

"Engage people affected by decisions and actions in raising, seeking out and resolving objections to decisions and actions, following an 8-step process: 1. Consent to Driver, 2. Present Proposal, 3. Answer Clarifying Questions, 4. Brief Response Round, 5. Check for Objections, 6. Resolve Objections, 7. Celebrate!, 8. Hear Concerns."

What:

Facilitated Process.

TIPS:

"Look for the needs beyond decisions and actions to find both and more when there is an objection. Connect with Driver Description (WePractice Red Card), Role Description and Proposal Forming (WePractice Purple Card).
